About the review

The university was originally approved for 15 students. Over time the university increased that number, unaware of formal processes around course changes to cohort sizes. That number was then further increased as a result of a surge in applications this academic session, attributed to Covid-19 and a sector wide increase in applications as a result of the pandemic. This means that the university is now seeking approval for their current cohort size of 60 students.

The inspectors have reviewed evidence submitted in support of these changes, including Staff Information documents, job adverts and CVs; Practice Handbook; placement provider information and Course Information document.



Findings

The inspectors reviewed documentation around current staffing, timetables and job adverts; although it was not clear exactly how the new staff would be deployed. Inspectors are satisfied that there will be an adequate number of staff of appropriately qualified staff in place but it is on the assumption that newly recruited staff would work across all programmes and timetable gaps would be met.

Inspectors are satisfied that recruitment of an additional practice educator and work being undertaken in conjunction with placement partners means that there will be adequate number of placements and of appropriately qualified and experienced staff involved in practice based learning for the increase in cohort size.

The documentation and weblinks received and reviewed made references to the previous regulator and indicated that upon successful completion of the course students would be eligible to register with that previous regulator. The university were advised of the references and the inspectors were advised that this had been amended and updated with new links and documents provided. However, not all links and documents were fully updated, some were partially updated and provided information around both current and previous regulator which is confusing and conflicting information for students and potential students. Therefore, approval of the changes is dependent on all websites and documents being fully updated to show Social Work England as the regulator. Wording also needs to be updated around successful completion of the course as this will make students eligible to apply for registration, not eligible for registration.

The review team reviewed documentation showing some involvement of people with lived experience of social work in the course through the SUCCESS group. Information provided was limited and when asked if the university had further documentation they wished to provide, no further information was sent. Therefore, the inspectors recommend that the University review this involvement ready for the introduction of the new 2021 education and training standards and how people with lived experience of social work might have more involvement across the course.
